## **ACTION TAKEN REPORT 2020-2021**

- An orientation programme was conducted to familiarise NAAC criteria committee members with the various metrics of the seven criteria and the NAAC accreditation process at the college.
- A successful induction programme was organised for first-year students, fostering an
  inclusive and supportive environment for their transition to college life.
- Departments provided a one-week bridge course and regular induction sessions to address the varying learning levels of newly admitted students in 2020.
- Various skill development and capacity-building programmes, including personality development, youth empowerment, short film reviews, anger management, mental stress reduction, and prevention of narcotic crimes, were organised by departments, clubs, and cells throughout the year.
- HoDs initiated the creation of WhatsApp groups for departmental alumni and collected their details.
- Feedback from students, teachers, and other stakeholders regarding curriculum delivery and student support facilities on campus was collected and analysed.
- · Revisions are made to every policy.
- Establishment of psychology laboratory.
- The college, under IQAC's initiative, revised policies regarding bridge courses, remedial coaching, internal examinations, student grievance handling, infrastructure maintenance, scholarships, and HR, to be implemented from 2021-22 onwards.
- CASC launched the Jaivam organic farming project as a means of promoting sustainable development.
- A comprehensive appraisal of faculty and staff was introduced by the college under IQAC's initiative, including self-appraisal and appraisal by the head of the institution.



- A mentor-mentee system was implemented to provide academic support to students in need, following IQAC recommendations.
- The college allocated resources worth Rs. 17,000 towards the e-governance initiative, which aims to enhance administrative efficiency, transparency, and service delivery.
  - Departments offered additional add-on and certificate courses to improve student competency, with the college hosting 9 add-on courses this year.
  - The college has initiated the RUKKIYA UMMA scholarship programme, which
    provides free scholarships worth Rs. 8,47,000 to deserving students and aims to
    alleviate financial burdens and promote equitable access to education.
  - All faculty members prepared course plans and monthly progress reports promptly.
  - Print materials that outline the criteria for NAAC accreditation were distributed to all the teachers by the IQAC team.
  - The college allocated resources worth Rs. 25,000 towards e-governance initiatives that aim to enhance administrative efficiency, transparency, and service delivery.
  - · Cells, clubs, and committees were reconstituted as necessary.
  - Student participation in Entrepreneurship Development (ED) Club activities showed improvement.
  - Department-wise performance of students in university-level examinations was assessed, and measures to support weaker students were initiated by HoDs and respective committees in line with IQAC recommendations.
